HISTORY



Tredethy House, now a small country house hotel nearby Helland village, was once the home of Prince Chula of Siam, who was the great grandson of King Mongkut, of the King and I fame. In Bodmin, you can see a granite drinking trough, gifted to the town, in honour of Joan, his wire haired terrier and bulldog, Hercules.

WELCOME TO HELLAND

The beautiful village of Helland is situated 2.5 miles east of the industrial town of Bodmin; surrounded mostly by farmland and affording the most stunning views.

The focal points of the village are the Parish Church, the village hall, Helland Pottery, the Grade II Listed, 15th Century Bridge and the walking and cycling route, the Camel Trail. The village hall was instituted in the late 1960s, after the closure of the village school. Over the years, it has been extended and modernised and is now utilised most days for various events, gatherings and activities.

Helland Church is dedicated to St Helena, the mother of Constantine. The church is pre-Norman with stonework probably dating to the 13th Century. The word Helland, comes from Hele, meaning holy corner. The church recorded its first vicar in 1289 and was attached to the Priory in Bodmin.

Hellandbridge, circa 1470s, is one of two original bridges. The other removed by a vast flood in 1847. Each of its arches, five in total, is different in size and shape.

THE CAMEL TRAIL

The Camel Trail is a vital route passing through the parish and is a lovely walking and cycling trail. It links the village to Wenfordbridge and to the towns of Bodmin, Wadebridge and Padstow on the north Cornwall coast.

Helland Pottery stands on the banks of the River Camel near the bridge and is the home of the renowned potter, Paul Jackson and his wife, Rosie. Their garden is recognised as a small noteworthy garden and is open to visit daily, for a small donation to charity.
